The Nickell Family Papers contain family photographs taken from the 1920s through the 1940s. Many of the photographs are of a young L.A. Nickell, Jr. The collection also contains a depreciation summary report for the Columbia Ice Plant compiled in 1927.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Lindsey A. Nickell, Jr., born January 7, 1922, was the son of Lindsey A. Nickell, Sr. (1887-1981) and Virginia Knight. They lived in Columbia, Missouri, and managed the Columbia Ice Plant, also known as the Hetzler Ice Plant. L.A. Nickell Jr. attended the University of Missouri and served in World War II. He worked with his father at the ice plant until leukemia took his life on August 6, 1951, at the age of 29.
