INTRODUCTION

Ten photographs of the Lincoln University campus, ca. 1903.

DONOR INFORMATION

The collection was donated to the State Historical Society of Missouri by an unknown donor on date unknown.

ORGANIZATIONAL SKETCH

Lincoln University was founded as Lincoln Institute in 1866 by members of the 62nd United States Colored Infantry. Located in Jefferson City, Missouri, the Institute was designed to provide education for African-Americans. Following operation in a temporary location, use of the Institute's long-term campus began in 1871. In 1879, Lincoln became a state institution and subsequently a land grant institution under the second Morrill Act of 1890. Its name was changed to Lincoln University in 1921.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The photographs depict features of the Lincoln University campus, which was then known as Lincoln Institute. The images focus almost exclusively on physical features of the campus, located in Jefferson City, Missouri. Most of the photos are devoid of people, and those including people are posed. Images are arranged by subject matter.

1096-03	Young Men's Dormitory	Exterior front and side of a two-story brick building, the men's dormitory at the Lincoln Institute; two men standing in front.
1096-04	Alexander Chinn Hall	Exterior of Chinn Hall, a 2-story brick building also known as the Industrial Building; man standing at entrance
1096-05	President's Home	Exterior front and side of a two-story brick home, showing porch and landscape.

1096-06	Study Hall	Interior of an empty study hall, including desks, murals, and a map.
1096-07	Auditorium	Interior view of an empty auditorium, decorated with flags, garland, Greek letters, Latin motto, and two portraits, one of Lincoln's president Benjamin F. Allen and another of Abraham Lincoln.
1096-08	Forge Room	Interior of an empty forge room.
1096-09	Machine Shop	Interior of empty machine shop.
1096-10	President's Office	Interior of the President's Office, which includes male typist (far right), chalkboard, chairs, and three portraits.
