Hughes/Simmons Drug Store Records

1872-1954

87 volumes, 238 folders (MICROFILM)

Business records of a drug store in Liberty, Missouri: daybooks; journals; want books; an inventory book; a poison register; and invoices for goods purchased by store, which display late nineteenth and early twentieth century illustrated letterheads with representations of the buildings and goods of the firms.

HISTORY:

Daniel Hughes, Jr., began working for S.W. Warren in his drug store in Liberty, Missouri, in 1865 and became a partner in 1870. In 1872 he purchased the business. He carried, "a large and well selected stock of goods in his line..." and the business prospered. In 1877, Hughes remodeled his old building into the Italianate style it has today.

Joseph C. Simmons bought the store from Hughes in 1887 and operated it until his death 58 years later. Hughes continued to live in Liberty, Missouri, and became one of the organizers of the First National Bank of Liberty one of the founders of the Physicians and Surgeons Supply Company of Kansas City, Missouri.

Over the years Simmons hired several men to work at the store. Will Marr worked in the store from about 1922 until 1945, and Clarence Ferril worked at various times from as early as 1916. When Joseph Simmons died in 1945, his estate sold the drug store to Dr. William H. Goodson, Sr., who had maintained an office in the building since 1907. Goodson hired Ferril as the druggist and continued the company until his own death in an automobile accident in 1963. Clarence Ferril retired the following year.

Dr. Goodson's heirs sold the building and its contents to the Clay County Museum Association. The Association operated a museum in the building dedicated to the history of the county, displaying artifacts, including items from the drug store which occupied the structure for more than one hundred years.

PROVENANCE:

This collection was loaned to the State Historical Society of Missouri to be microfilmed and then returned to their owner, the Clay County Museum in Liberty, Missouri. The records, plus an addition, were received as accession KA0231 on February 22, 1984.

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PREFERRED CITATION:

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DESCRIPTION:

The collection contains the financial records of the Hughes/Simmons Drug Store between the years 1872 and 1954, and is divided into five record groups: Daybooks (1880-1941); Journals (1872-1919); Want books (c.1917?); an Inventory Book (1880); and a Poison Register (1881-1954).

Within the Daybook group are memorandum books which appear to be an informal record of the information contained in the larger daybooks. These memorandum books have been placed in chronological order within the daybook series.

Also, within the Journal record group several cash books and a number of 'order books' have been included. In some instances these records overlap in time and content with the information contained in the journal books. In as much as these sub-series represented substantially the same type of record, it was determined they should be placed into a single chronological sequence.

The Inventory notes of a given Journal book lacks an index. Three undated index volumes have been placed at the end of the Journal record group. These volumes do not appear to relate to any of the existing volumes in the series.

The Want books represent a listing of items requested by customers at various times. The items have been checked off which may mean the goods were obtained.

The Inventory book for the year 1880 is a simple listing of the stock owned by the store at that time.

Lastly, the Poison Register is a list of the controlled substances dispensed by the druggist, to whom they were sold, and for what purposes.

The addition contains two daybooks which were not filmed in the daybook series microfilmed earlier.

The bulk of the addition contains invoices for goods purchased by the drug store. These are arranged in chronological sequence within their original alphabetical order. An alphabetical list of the firms represented by invoices is appended to this inventory.

Additionally, one letter unrelated to the activities of the Drug Store but pertaining to Daniel Hughes is in folder 238. This letter concerns the remodeling of the First National Bank of Liberty, Missouri, of which Hughes was an organizer.

One interesting aspect of the invoices is the large number of late nineteenth and early twentieth century illustrated letterheads with engraved and lithographic representations of the buildings and goods of the firms.

This document differs from the remainder of the collection in that it is unrelated to the Hughes/Simmons Drug Store records.
