**Historical Note:**

In 1960, Carl Lowenstein donated money to the University of Kansas City, now the University of Missouri-Kansas City, for the annual award of a Native Sons of Kansas City Prize in Local History. All full-time registered students at the University were eligible to submit essays that contributed to the knowledge of the Greater Kansas City area. The papers in the collection are the winners of that prize.
