HISTORICAL SKETCH

Oscar H. Cogswell operated a store in Independence, Missouri. He was a judge of the Jackson County Court in 1862.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The records consist of a ledger that documents financial transactions for O. H. Cogswell and Company in Independence, Missouri, covering the period 2/20/1855 – 1/1/1857. The ledger records the names of buyers; goods purchased; and costs. A list of customers and index, compiled around 1955 by the Native Sons of Kansas City, is included with the records.
