Biographical Note:

Born in 1806 in Kentucky, Albert Gallatin Boone, grandson of Daniel Boone, became one of the most notable personalities of Westport, Missouri. In 1848, Boone entered a business partnership with William Bernard in Westport, supplying the Santa Fe Trail. In 1859, Boone was appointed agent for the southwestern Native American tribes. Boone moved with his family to Colorado in 1861, selling his property in Westport to Jim Bridger. Boone died in 1884.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged by material type. Folders seven and eight contain multiple types of materials but relate to a particular person or people. Items have been arranged chronologically within the folders.

Scope and Content Note:

The collection contains deeds and other documents reflecting property and business transactions primarily involving A. G. Boone and other residents of Westport, Missouri, such as John C. McCoy. Notable among them are a Power of Attorney document granted by Louis Vasquez to A.G. Boone in 1854, business papers of Boone and Bernard in Westport, and a list of Shawnee deprecation claims. In addition, correspondence between the original donor, Mary Reynolds, and James Anderson of the Native Sons of Kansas City provides biographical information on Boone.
