Historical Note:

Bernadine Rose Morast was born in Kansas City, Missouri, on November 3, 1914, to Harry Morast and Jessie E. Becker. Morast married George William Dunn on October 25, 1939, in Jackson County, Missouri. According to the 1940 United States Federal Census, she lived in Mission, Kansas, with her husband and in-laws. The census reported that she had a high school education and listed her current occupation as a nurse. She passed away on June 13, 2000, at the Carondelet Manor and is buried at the Mt. Moriah Cemetery in Kansas City, Missouri. No additional historical information could be found.

Arrangement:

The scrapbook has been arranged into seven folders.

Scope and Content Note:

Folders one through six consist of clippings, programs for operas, plays, recitals, and commencements, and ticket stubs for events held in the Kansas City metropolitan area. Event venues included the Convention Hall, Ararat Temple, Shubert Theatre, Grand Avenue Temple, Ivanhoe Auditorium, Linwood High School, Jewish Community Center, and the Athenaeum. Additional materials include magazine clippings of biographical information for various composers, singers, and actors. Folder seven contains loose items from the scrapbook, these include programs and clippings.

Please note that a loose newspaper article entitled, "Tonight's Concert Patrons Will Pay Tribute to Mozart's Musical Genius," from the *Kansas City Star* dated November 12, 1934, was damaged beyond repair and could not be saved.
