Historical Note:

The Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity of America is an American collegiate social fraternity for men who have a special interest in music. Originally founded as the Sinfonia Club at the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, Massachusetts, in 1898, by Ossian Everett Mills, the club strove to develop the advancement of music by either adopting music as a profession or becoming an advocate for music.

The fraternity held its first national convention in 1900, in Boston, Massachusetts, where several chapters established a national constitution. The fraternity has local, regional, and national levels of governance and boasts an active membership of over 7,000 with over 240,000 initiated members. Today there are 248 active collegiate chapters throughout the United States.

Arrangement:

The collection arranged by size in two folders. Materials within those folders have been arranged chronologically.

Scope and Content Note:

The Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity-Epsilon Mu Chapter Records consists of two folders. Folder one contains photographic portraits of three award recipients, Russell Patterson who received an unknown award in 1969, Dr. J. Milford Crabb who received the Man of the Year Award in 1971, and Dr. Frank Buebendorf who received the Musician of the Year Award in 1976. Dr. Buebendorf's award portrait is a biographical certificate. Folder two contains four oversize biographical certificates highlighting the career achievements of each recipient along with a photograph of the recipient. These certificates were given for the Musician of the Year award dating from 1962 to 1965. The certificates were presented to Hans Schwieger, Clyde E. Neibarger, Dr. Archie N. Hones, and Franklyn S. Weddler.
