Historical Note:

Joseph Rosenthal was born in 1882, in Suwalki, Russia. Rosenthal lived in Paris, France, prior to his immigration to the United States. Rosenthal arrived in New York in 1906, with the intention of eventually settling in Texas. He first went to Chicago to visit his sister, and then stopped in Kansas City. While in Kansas City, he met Bella Cohen, whom he married in 1916. Rosenthal worked as a tailor for several garment companies in the greater Kansas City area. Joseph and Bella were both active members of Tefereth Israel Congregation, now Congregation Beth Israel Abraham and Voliner. Rosenthal retired in 1951 from the Bond Clothing Company and passed away in 1958.

The collection has been arranged into a single folder.

Scope and Content Note:

Collection consists of a single volume of genealogical information regarding the Rosenthal, Loeffler, Cohen, Ziman, Greenberg, and Wedeles families. The collection covers the historical accounts of these families throughout the 19th and 20th centuries, and seeks to fit the family's history within the greater global context of Jewish history during that time. For example, the history provides background on the Jewish regions in the Pale of Russia, the Holocaust, the Zionist movement, and the mass migration of Jewish families to the United States. The collection also focuses on the family's involvement in the Greater Kansas City Jewish community.
