Historical Note:

Situated at 93rd & Nall Avenue in present-day Prairie Village, Kansas, Meadowbrook Golf & Country Club began in 1930 as the Belle Air Country Club with an 18-hole golf course on land held by the family of its president, W. L. Bleier. Belle Air was sold in 1947, and at that point had been opened to the public. It sold again in 1953, this time to a group of businessmen led by Paul Berman. They had 200 charter members ready for a return to private club status as the Meadowbrook Country Club.

Financial struggles caused Meadowbrook to sell its property in 2010; the deficit stemmed from declining membership. Meadowbrook was unable to recover from its financial decline and closed in October 2014.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged into one folder. Contents within the folder are arranged chronologically.

Scope and Content Note:

This collection contains seven issues dating from 1962 to 1967 of *Meadowbrook Birdie*, a newsletter for Meadowbrook Golf & Country Club in Overland Park, Kansas (present-day Prairie Village, Kansas). The newsletter outlines past and future activities and events at the country club, as well as announcements regarding club members. The collection does not contain a complete run of the newsletter within the date range.
