These are five booklets containing the minutes of the annual sessions of the Liberty Association of Free Will Baptists for the years 1971, 1974, 1976, 1977, and 1978. The Association met at the Niangua Youth Camp near Niangua in Webster County, Missouri.

The Liberty Association of Free Will Baptists was organized in about 1936. These are minutes of the 35<sup>th</sup>, 38<sup>th</sup>, 40<sup>th</sup>, 41<sup>st</sup>, and 42<sup>nd</sup> annual sessions of the Association. Most of the congregations were located in Webster and Laclede counties in Missouri, although Springfield First Free Will Baptist Church in Greene County was the largest single congregation. Between 16 and 20 churches were members during this period.
