Historical Note:

William Moses Damron was born in Pike County, Kentucky, on March 9, 1853, the son of William Damron and Rutha Pike. He married Virginia “Jennie” Davis sometime prior to the 1880 census. William and Virginia lived for a time in Ohio and Kentucky before settling in Joplin in 1887, where he worked as an itinerant preacher for the Free Will Baptist Church of Southwest Missouri. In the 1910 census, his profession is listed as farmer, and he dug the occasional grave for extra income. According to family stories, William loved music. He played in a cornet band and prepared at least one sermon about music in worship. William Damron died September 23, 1923.
