Historical Note:

Rock Fountain Court is a series of freestanding tourist cabins that was popular along Route 66. Built in 1945, Rock Fountain Court got its name from the iconic fountain, now demolished, that stood in front of the cabins. These cabins are now known as the Melinda Court Apartments, located on College Street in Springfield, Missouri.

The School of the Ozarks, located at Point Lookout, Missouri, was established in 1906, to provide quality Christian education in exchange for work to help with school operations. Initially started as a high school, the School of the Ozarks slowly added on programs of higher learning, gaining full-accreditation as a university in 1971. In 1990, the Board of Trustees changed the name to the College of the Ozarks continuing the tradition of the Work Education Program. The Williams Memorial Chapel, an example of neo-Gothic architecture was dedicated in 1956.
