Mrs. John C. Talbot donated the Kroeger Family Papers to the Western Historical Manuscript Collection on November 9, 1984.

Dr.Ernest Kroeger (August 10, 1862 to April 7, 1934) was a noted composer, pianist, organist, lecturer and writer on musical subjects. He directed the Kroeger School of Music which he founded in 1904 after successfully completing his responsibilities as musical director of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, a position which earned the composer election as an officer of the French Academy. Dr. Kroeger also served as the dean of the music department at Washington University, director of music for John Burroughs School and the Taylor School for Boys, president of the Music Teachers National Association and as president of the Missouri Music Teachers Association. He held membership in the National Institute of Arts and Letters and the American Guild of Organists.

Mr. Kroeger's compositions were extensively published in the United States and Europe and were considered typical of the best work by American composers. His compositions include a suite entitled "Lalla Rookh", the orchestral composition "The Mississippi" and the piano pieces "Egaria", "Dance of the Elves" and "March of the Indian Phantoms". Although the collection contains no examples of Dr. Kroeger's musical work a significant amount can be found at the Gaylord Music Library of Washington University.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Kroeger family papers contain correspondence, documents, publications, notes and photographs relating to Ernest R. Kroeger, Laura Kroeger, nee Clark (wife), A.E. Kroeger (father), Julia and Alice Kroeger (sisters), Beatrice and Louise Kroeger (daughters), Richard Kroeger (son), John and Elanor Talbot (daughter and husband), William Talbot (grandson) and two relatives of Laura Kroeger, Jacob Clark and Eva Turner Clark. Other items which researchers may find interesting include a newsletter from the Shakespeare Fellowship, a publication on union factories issued by the Boot and Shoe Workers in 1929, and a program from an opera performance attended by Dr. Kroeger in Bavaria in 1889 (in German).

# **SERIES DESCRIPTION**

1. correspondence, 1850-1960, folders 1 - 8: Correspondence in the collection is for the most part personal ranging from transcriptions of letters written in the 1850's by Jacob Clark (a relative of Mrs. E.R. Kroeger) to John E. Braly concerning the state of things in Missouri, his health and that of other members of his congregation. the personal correspondence of Mr. and Mrs. E.R. Kroeger includes predominantly letters to each other when Mrs. Kroeger went east in 1933. It also includes three letters written by John Masefield (a relative of Laura Kroeger) during WWI to the Kroegers' three daughters. Two scrapbooks contain condolence

- correspondence regarding the deaths of Dr. Kroeger's two sisters, Alice and Julia. John C. Talbot (son-in-law) is represented by twenty pieces of correspondence most regarding his position as assistant to the chancellor at Washington University.
- 2. documents, 1874- 1953, folders 9 12: The series contains a selection of certificates of royalty and transfer of copyright relating to Dr. Kroegers musical compositions and various certificates awarded to Dr. and Mrs. Kroeger for their contributions to music and education.
- 3. publications, 1879-1940, folders 13 22: The publications in the collection include an 1879 edition of The Western magazine containing an article by Dr. Kroegers father on Fredrich Hohenstauffen II, a catalog from the Kroeger Music School with a listing of faculty, school policies and fees. A 1940 edition of the Shakespeare Fellowship newsletter and a transcription of an address regarding the fellowship delivered by Eva Turner Clark in 1936. Three biographical pieces on Dr. Kroeger and the program from an opera performance he attended in Bavaria in 1889 (in German).
- 4. miscellaneous, 1915-1946, folders 23 25: This series contains a notes made by various family members, recipes, membership cards, a poem by E.R. Kroeger, information on the Town Club and a statement of financial affairs and policy of the St. Louis Junior Red Cross.
- 5. diaries, 1947 and 1960, folders 26 and 27: 2 diaries with daily entries for the years 1947 and 1960 compiled by John C. Talbot.
- 6. photographs, nd: folders 28 34: 142 family photographs of the snapshot or portrait variety
