Abstract: The Eastern Missouri Collection is an artificial collection combining miscellaneous small acquisitions related to Missouri places, individuals, organizations, and events. Scope and Content Note:

Manuscripts and Photographs

This series contains letters, postcards, photographs, booklets, pamphlets, maps, and ribbons relating to Eastern Missouri places, individuals, organizations, and events. Subjects include Union Station, the 1904 Louisiana Purchase Exposition, Natural Bridge Road in St. Louis, the St. Louis Botanical Gardens, and civil defense. The series is arranged chronologically by the year the State Historical Society of Missouri accessioned them.

Audio-Visual Materials

This series contains a reel of film and a roll of microfilm pertaining to Eastern Missouri places. The reel of film contains photography of Highway 70 going west before and after the addition of the Florissant Road exit in St. Louis County. The microfilm (ANSI Format) contains the minutes of the St. Louis County Historic Buildings Commission, from 1956 to 1990. The materials are arranged chronologically by the year the State Historical Society of Missouri accessioned them.

Oversize

This series contains posters, photographs, and a political cartoon pertaining to Eastern Missouri places, individuals, organizations and events. Subjects include the Carl Milles Fountain at Union Station, Homer G. Phillips Hospital, an advertisement for a musical concert featuring Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash, and Carl Perkins, and the construction of KETC's Television tower in 1953.
